The Incarnation

At the center of Christmas is Jesus, both fully God and fully man. "In Bethlehem, humility and glory in their extremes were joined," wrote pastor R.G. Lee (1886-1978). When Jesus came to earth, Lee explained, he descended:

- from the heights of glory to the depths of shame,
- from the wonders of heaven to the wickedness of earth.
- from exaltation to humiliation.
- from the throne to the tree,
- from dignity to debasement,
- from worship to wrath,
- from the halls of heaven to the nails of earth,
- from the coronation to the curse,
- from the glory place to the gory place!

"Born in a stable! Cradled in a cattle trough! Wrapped in swaddling clothes of poverty!" Lee wrote. "No room for him who made all rooms! [No] place for him who made and knows all places! Oh, deep humiliation of the Creator — born of the creature, woman! But in his descent was the dawn of mercy. Because we cannot ascend to him, he descends to us."



- 5. Decorate your Christmas tree with stickers or jewels.







A Lamplighter Devotion: GOD IS WITH YOU

"They shall call His name Immanuel," which translated means, "God with us." MATTHEW 1:23 (NASB1995)

This Christmas, consider this amazing truth: the indescribably awesome, infinite Lord of all that exists took on a form like yours and walked the earth so He could know what it is like to be you (<u>Hebrews 2:17</u>).

Consider the love He exhibited on your behalf as He "emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, and . . . humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross" (Philippians 2:7–8). Not only that, but He gave you His own Holy Spirit to counsel and comfort you in every situation you ever encounter.

Friend, you are never, ever alone or helpless. God Himself is with you. Regardless of where you are or what you experience, you are absolutely assured of His wonderful and loving presence.

This is the amazing gift of joy that the Savior gives you—He unfailingly accompanies, empowers, equips, and encourages you through every moment and circumstance of life. So keep your heart set on Him and rejoice in the great gift He's given you!

PRAYER: Jesus, thank You for being with me regardless of what I face. What a gift You are. To You be all the glory, honor, and praise! Amen.

In His presence . . . rejoice that He's with you.

Matthew 1:18–25 (NKJV1982) Now the birth of Jesus Christ was as follows: After His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, before they came together, she was found with child of the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ Then Joseph her husband, being a just man, and not wanting to make her a public example, was minded to put her away secretly. ²⁰ But while he thought about these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take to you Mary your wife, for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit. ²¹ And she will bring forth a Son, and you shall call His name JESUS, for He will save His people from their sins." ²² So all this was done that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the Lord through the prophet, saying: ²³ "Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and bear a Son, and they shall call His name Immanuel," which is translated, "God with us." ²⁴ Then Joseph, being aroused from sleep, did as the angel of the Lord commanded him and took to him his wife, ²⁵ and did not know her till she had brought forth her firstborn Son. And he called His name JESUS.

<u>Hebrews 2:14–18</u> (NKJV1982) Inasmuch then as the children have partaken of flesh and blood, He Himself likewise shared in the same, that through death He might destroy him who had the power of death, that is, the devil, ¹⁵ and release those who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage. ¹⁶ For indeed He does not give aid to angels, but He does give aid to the seed of Abraham. ¹⁷ Therefore, in all things He had to be made like His brethren, that He might be a merciful and faithful High Priest in things pertaining to God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people. ¹⁸ For in that He Himself has suffered, being tempted, He is able to aid those who are tempted.

<u>Philippians 2:5–11</u> (NKJV1982) Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus, ⁶ who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God, ⁷ but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, and coming in the likeness of men. ⁸ And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross. ⁹ Therefore God also has highly exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name, ¹⁰ that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those in heaven, and of those on earth, and of those under the earth, ¹¹ and that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.



Prayer, Fasting and Casting a Vision - UPDATE

As a reminder, the Administrative Board and the Vision Task Force continue to work together to dialogue about where God may be leading our congregation. The leadership identified these areas as initiatives that God may be calling us to pursue. These include 1) remodeling and expanding the Kitchen, 2) enhancing security measures during public events and 3) implementing some sort of alternative education program such as a Christian Micro-school for parents who are looking for options beyond the public school system.

As I reported in November, the Administrative Board tasked one of its members to work on #2 above. He has taken information provided to the Board from the Lamplighters Team and is drafting a security plan proposal.

At its November meeting, the Administrative Board approved the names of six people to serve on the Microschool Sub Task Force. The Task Force will tentatively have its first meeting in December. Modified facilities plans from Noelker and Hull Associates, the architectural firm with whom we are consulting, should be ready soon for presentation. Both the Sub Task Force and the presentation of the plans fall under the purview of #3 above.

As you can see, this update is brief, and I wouldn't be surprised if next month's is brief as well. The holidays tend to slow down works that are in progress. Nonetheless, please continue to be in prayer asking God to guide us so that we will go forward according to His will and purpose. Pray that He will open and shut doors accordingly.



The children of Enola First Church of God have made Christian Symbol Christmas ornaments called Chrismons and will place them on the Children's Christmas tree in the living room outside the sanctuary. Chrismons are a type of Christmas tree decoration found in many churches using symbols that represent biblical concepts that are recognized by believers.

The Christian symbols on the tree include the crown, a symbol for the kingship of our Lord, Jesus Christ, the King of kings and Lord of lords (1 Timothy 6:15), the five pointed Epiphany star, which represents the star that guided the Magi to Jesus; the dove, the symbol for

the Holy Spirit (Mark 1:10); the fish, a secret sign used by early Christians to designate themselves as believers in Jesus; the lamb, a symbol that Jesus was the Lamb of God and also that He is the Shepherd and we are His flock; and the cross, a symbol of Christ's sacrifice for our sins, bringing forgiveness and salvation.

All of the children hope you enjoy their tree of Chrismons made to celebrate the birth of our Savior. Happy Birthday Jesus!


