Make a catch of fish to show what happens when Jesus calls his first disciples.

What you need:

- Cardboard egg carton
- Acrylic paint
- Paintbrush
- Darning needle
- Fishing twine
- Scissors
- Googly eyes or buttons
- Glue



What you do:


- 1. From the egg carton, cut out the 12 cups. From the lid, cut out two fish tails.
- On a protected surface, turn the cups upside down. Paint the outside of each cup and both sides of the tails. Let dry.
- 3. Thread the needle with an arm's length of twine. Tie a knot at the end.
- 4. Thread the needle through the end of the tail. Tie another knot an inch from the tail.
- Thread the needle through one upside-down cup. Pull the twine through until the cup rests on the knot.
- 6. Continue tying knots an inch above each cup and threading on another cup until you've strung six cups. Tie a knot above the last cup and leave a long string to hang the fish. (You can make two fish with each egg carton.)
- 7. Add googly eyes or buttons to the last cup to make a face.

When fishermen obeyed Jesus and let down their nets, they caught so many fish that their boats began to sink! Simon Peter fell at Jesus' knees. What happened next?



AMOS: A WAKE-UP CALL FROM GOD

In January, Pastor Jensen will resume the Amos message series at the 8:00 and 10:30 AM Worship Services. The book of Amos is relevant to our world today. It offers prophetic warnings against the practices of idolatry, greed and oppression. Amos addresses God's enemies, but he really zeroes in on speaking to God's people, Israel. In our world today, God's enemies and His people, especially His people, need to "wake up"

and repent of the wickedness that God abhors and embrace justice and righteousness which are the foundation of His throne. This is the essence of Amos's wake-up call from God. Hopes great and small

"The Christian lives with three hopes, two great and one small," writes Bryan Wolfmueller. In his "Wednesday What-Not" blog, the pastor explains: "Our first



great hope is in Christ our Redeemer, whose death and resurrection are our forgiveness, life, salvation and great hope. Our second great hope is in Christ the King returning soon to judge the living [and] the dead, and establish the new heaven and earth where the righteous dwell. This is our hope for the resurrection and the life of the world to come."

Amazingly, there's more! "Sandwiched between these two great hopes is our small hope, our lesser hope, our hope for tomorrow, our hope that we might begin to love and serve our neighbor, and do some little something to bless the people around us," Wolfmueller continues. "This is the hope that energizes our vocations, that motivates our love, and that is the reason we make New Year's resolutions. We hope that we might do something a little bit better tomorrow than we did yesterday."

The pastor concludes, "If this was our only hope, it would be despair. But sandwiched between the love of Christ and the joy of the resurrection, this little hope is wonderful, and certainly not to be despised."

A Lamplighter Devotion:

Placed in the light

If we walk in the light, as He is in the light, ... the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanseth us from all sin. 1 John 1:7.

To mistake conscious freedom from sin for deliverance from sin by the Atonement is a great error. No man knows what sin is until he is born again. Sin is what Jesus Christ faced on Calvary. The evidence that I am delivered from sin is that I know the real nature of sin in me. It takes the last reach of the Atonement of Jesus Christ, that is, the impartation of His absolute perfection, to make a man know what sin is.

The Holy Spirit applies the Atonement to us in the unconscious realm as well as in the realm of which we are conscious, and it is only when we get a grasp of the unrivalled power of the Spirit in us that we understand the meaning of 1 John 1:7, "the blood of Jesus Christ cleanseth us from all sin." This does not refer to conscious sin only, but to the tremendously profound understanding of sin which only the Holy Ghost in me realizes.

If I walk in the light as God is in the light, not in the light of my conscience, but in the light of God—if I walk there, with nothing folded up, then there comes the amazing revelation—the blood of Jesus Christ cleanses me from all sin so that God Almighty can see nothing to censure in me. In my consciousness it works with a keen poignant knowledge of what sin is. The love of God at work in me makes me hate with the hatred of the Holy Ghost all that is not in keeping with God's holiness. To walk in the light means that everything that is of the darkness drives me closer into the center of the light.

Prayer, Fasting and Casting a Vision - UPDATE

As a reminder, the Administrative Board and the Vision Task Force continue to work together to dialogue about where God may be leading our congregation. The leadership identified these areas as initiatives that God may be calling us to pursue. These include 1) remodeling and expanding the Kitchen, 2) enhancing security measures during public events and 3) implementing some sort of alternative education program such as a Christian Micro-school for parents who are looking for options beyond the public school system.

On December 9, 2024, the Microschool Launch Sub Task Force held its first meeting. Much progress was made concerning area number 3 of the vision mentioned above. We will be working through "The Samuel School" to establish our own campus which will take on the name "The Samuel School, Enola Campus". The meeting on December 9 focused on establishing three important matters related to this initiative: MODEL, MISSION and MONEY (that is, fundraising). Below is a summary of what was established at the meeting.

MODEL – The proposal is for the school to take on the following characteristics

-Christian

- -God's word will be at the center of the teaching
- -The Bible will be the guiding influence for the philosophy and pedagogy
- -Reference to 1 Peter 3:15

-Classical

- -Focus on goodness, truth and beauty with excellence
- -Curriculum including literature, history, math, science, arts and music
- -Cultivating thinking and explaining processes in attention to mastery of content

-Church-Based

- -Following the mission of ECOG
- -Providing a ministry to the community
- -Embracing the school as a ministry of the church
- -Separate corporation under the Samuel School

-Covenantal

- -Inwardly focused with faith-based families agreeing to Christian Principles rather that Missional which is outwardly focused to the community
- -At least one parent will sign a contract noting their belief in God and in Christian principles following the mission, vision and core values of the school

-Hybrid

- -Combination of private school and homeschooling
- -Parents work in partnership with the school
- -Teachers select curriculum for 2-3 days at school and the other days students are homeschooled

-Microschool

- -Small form of private school
- -School would be under the Samuel School private school charter

MISSION

- -A proposed mission statement will be developed
- -Jill Kilker provided handouts of sample mission statements which we will use at future meetings do develop our own.
- -We will also craft, in a similar fashion, a vision statement and a list of core values.

MONEY - That is, fundraising

- -\$2,000 have been received by the Samuel School for the Enola Campus through the PA Tax Credit initiative.
- -The Enola Campus has also received a pledge of \$1,000 from a private donor.
- -Tuition received from families will cover the Administrator and Teachers' part time salaries.
- -We will be working with local banks and financial institutions to secure funding through the PA Tax Credit initiative; banks are generous in supporting educational endeavors through the tax credit program.
- -Nate Cook will meet with us to help us understand more about how the tax credit program works and how to approach banks and invite them to participate.
- -The Samuel School main office will oversee the financial account of Enola Campus
- -The Enola Campus will be covered by The Samuel School's liability insurance.
- -The Samuel School advises that we should have an estimated \$25,000.00 in reserves prior to opening the Enola Campus.

We thank God for the progress that was made in area #3 by the Microschool Launch Sub Task Force. We look forward to reporting in the new year how God also leads us in areas #1 and 2. Please continue to be in prayer asking God to guide us so that we will go forward according to His will and purpose. Pray that He will open and shut doors accordingly.
